## FBCC approves creating private school as ministry

Our church took a monumental step in January by voting to create a School Council to begin a private school as a ministry of FBC-Castroville.

During the Jan. 15 business meeting, a previous proposal to start a full-time daycare was replaced with a recommendation to start a private school.

The church had created an ad hoc committee to research the possibility of a daycare to expand our children's ministry and to help bolster our budget. Led by Children's Minister Debra McDonel, the committee determined that the daycare had too many regulations and the state, through its licensing requirements, would have too much control over our church property and how we operate. Church Council members agreed with that assessment.

During the committee's research, the members heard from multiple people that there is a need for another Christian school in Castroville. The only other one is currently at St. Louis Catholic School.

Tentatively titled FBCC Academy, the school may open as soon as the next school year, with parents beginning to register their children in early spring. For that to happen, the School Council will need to begin meeting immediately so the church can advertise plans for the school.

Through bulletin announcements, a Facebook post and a church-wide email, the Nominating Committee was seeking volunteers to be considered for the School Council. Deadline for nominations was Jan. 26. The Council will be elected at the February business meeting.

Tentative plans are for the school, which is not regulated by the state, to serve 4-year-olds through second grade. The School Council will develop and recommend the policies and a curriculum and hire a Director. Those decisions will then be presented to the Church for approval.



### That's our hope 🖤

Romans 8:14-25 is an inspiring (and inspired) passage of Holy Writ. The first part of the passage describes our full and irrevocable position in Christ. We are God's adopted children. We have the right to cry unto Him with the gentle, parental call, "Abba, Father." Paul adds evidence showing that we can know this relationship is both real and rewarding: "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with Him in order that we may also be *glorified* with Him" (16-17).

Continuing on, Paul explains more about the nature of *glorification*. One thing to which to pay close attention is the mention of "suffering" (17-18). In Paul's thinking, suffering and glorification are entwined. Flip sides of the same coin. In fact, there's a subtle dualism ongoing in the passage. We suffer, but so does the creation. Paul states that, "the whole creation has been groaning together" (22), like a woman at the time of childbirth.

We have our own birth pains. Every time we feel lonely, every time we get frustrated with the injustice and evil of this world, every time we say to ourselves, "It shouldn't be that way!" What we experiencing is a kind of wistfulness, a longing for home, for a place we've never been before.

I'm discovering that even the progression of age, of having more internal parts that regularly fail me, and the inevitable slide toward death—even these correspond to the birth pains Paul mentions. Our old body is wearing out because it was never meant to be our permanent home. Someday, we will join the company of the faithful in Christ. We will *inhabit* a body far better than anything we've ever dreamed of; and we'll *inherit* a home that Jesus has personally constructed (and He was a carpenter!).

That's our hope. The Holy Spirit assures us we'll have it someday. Like the people of Israel for centuries looked forward to their Messiah, we look forward to the ultimate redemption, the completion of God's plan. The Holy Spirit resides in everyone who belongs to Jesus. You are not who you used to be. You can never be lost or unsaved again. And you have a magnificent eternal future to which to look forward.



I'm excited for a new year and continuing to study and work with the teens here at FBCC. Over the past month, on Wednesday nights, our students have been studying the Biblical analogy of "Sheep and Wolves". This language is repeated numerous times throughout the Bible in both the Old and New Testaments and it is important for us to understand the who, what, where, and when concerning the application of the "sheep and wolves" teaching throughout our Bible. First, we studied the character and the behavior of the wolves and sheep as described in Scripture. Then we took a look at where the Bible says these two groups exist, act, live, and/or operate. Afterward, the students explored the roles of the sheep and how we are told to treat wolves we may encounter. In February we will begin a new study which explores Biblical Truth compared to "False Doctrines" that we are warned about in Isaiah 5:18-20 and Acts 20:29-30.

Additionally, in our Sunday School hour we went back to the beginning to explore the Old Testament answering some tough questions about the accounts recorded there, and to develop a better understanding of how the Old and New Testament connect, while demonstrating God's consistency and sovereignty throughout Scripture. This is a great study for debunking common myths surrounding the Old Testament, but also develop a love for God's entire Word and His never changing character. Join us at 9:30 every Sunday morning.
