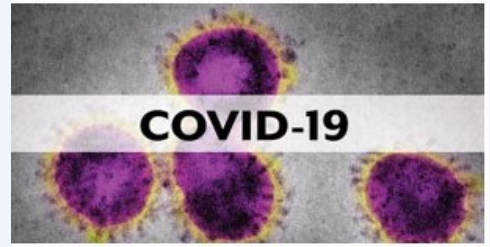

Unfortunately, with the schools' decision to delay re-opening until at least April 27, we cannot have that huge crowd here.

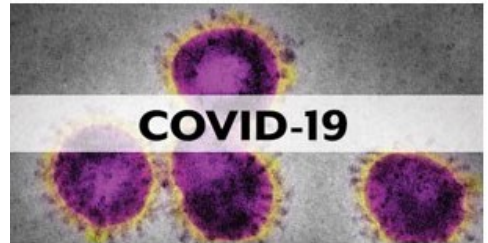

FBCC continues to minister during Coronavirus pandemic

Unprecedented. Unpredictable. COVID-19, the Coronavirus, has put us all in situations we've never experienced.

No one could have predicted that we would have only worshipped together on two Sundays in March 2020 and could not promise that we would be together for Easter Sunday.

Our leadership and staff have been making decisions without knowing what comes next. We've been using technology we've never tried before, and we've communicated constantly with our congregation through email, texts, social media and phone calls.

When Pastor Ben Craver and Deacon Chairman Andy Carnes started getting questions about whether we would meet on March 15 – due to school districts extending Spring Break, government leaders prohibiting large gatherings, Fiesta being postponed, and hoarding evident in grocery stores – there was a flurry of email traffic among many of our members before the final decision was made on Saturday morning to cancel services for the next day.

At the same time, they called a meeting for Sunday afternoon of Church Council, Deacons and staff to determine the next steps. Pastor Ben and Andy brought two options – meeting in two services with smaller crowds in each and sanitizing the sanctuary and restrooms between the two services or canceling all services and activities. Fifteen leaders shared their thoughts and voted overwhelmingly to not have services or weekly activities through March 29, which was the date school districts were using as their next decision date.

The leadership group decided that the offices would remain open because we must continue to minister to the community and our congregation. Pastor Ben prepared video messages and a sermon that could be shared on Facebook and on our website. We determined that trying to get the Praise Team to videotape would involve also getting the audio-visual team up at the church and could put all at risk of infection.

Meanwhile, we are paying our employees and have a building payment to make, but very, very, very few people have sent their tithes and offerings to the church. We ask you to prayerfully consider giving online through our website or mailing a check to the church. The Finance Committee is “meeting” virtually to determine how to best manage our financial obligations.

Missions Minister Tina Santee has continued her energetic leadership by providing hygiene items, practicing social distancing, and distributing vouchers for the March 19 Food Truck from a canopy outside the office building. She also has managed smaller food distributions during this time when families are home and sometimes without a paycheck.

Other staff members have publicized our ministries and responded to individuals who have approached the church for help, including providing that elusive toilet paper!

You will read elsewhere in this newsletter about how Children's Minister Debra McDonel is using their Facebook pages for AWANA and the Children's Ministry to teach Sunday School lessons and share links to keep kids entertained while learning about Jesus.

Student Minister Jeromy Kusch has shared some devotionals on The Movement's Facebook page, helped organize the food distributions and is conducting Bible studies for the youth through the Facebook page.

It is of primary importance for us to not only reach our community but also reach within our congregation to make sure we are helping each other. “Any crisis provides an opportunity to show the love of Jesus to our friends,” says Pastor Ben. “One simple approach is to check on them. Sunday School teachers can act similarly with their students. Let's think strategically about ways to communicate that we are here to help.”

Pastor Ben also calls for us to “join other Texas Baptist churches in praying for an end to the spread of the virus, for the healing of those affected, the safety of health care professionals and first responders, and for God to send revival through His people that we might boldly and lovingly share the faith.”

Because of the changes from government and schools coming day by day, the leadership group met on March 29 via conference call and decided to say we are canceling services and activities "until further notice."

We are mainly monitoring the school districts and following their lead. This necessitates canceling the Helicopter Easter Egg Drop on Resurrection Sunday.

Again, this situation is unprecedented and unpredictable. We will get through this because our Awesome God is in control!.

MONTHLY FOOD TRUCK CANCELED

The San Antonio Food Bank has canceled all food trucks until further notice because the stores that provide items to them do not have items to donate. We do plan to have small food distributions on Wednesdays through the Daily Bread ministry.




